This leads to: • food security through the supply of seafood products • growth of a sustainable blue economy • healthy, safe and sustainably managed seas and oceans It also helps achieve the UN's Sustainable Development Goal 14 ('conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas and marine resources'), to which the EU is committed. Furthermore, the EMFAF helps fulfil the objectives of the European Green Deal, the roadmap for the EU climate and environmental policies.

Enabling a sustainable blue economy in coastal, island and inland areas, and fostering the development of fishing and aquaculture communities. Strengthening international ocean governance and enabling seas and oceans to be safe, secure, clean and sustainably managed.
