The Slovak Republic established its National Access Point (NAP) according to the article 10.1 of Delegated Regulation (EU) 2017/1926 by means of the National Public Traffic Information website accessible at: https://odoprave.info.

The Slovak Republic provides for the NAP also in conformity with other delegated regulations of the Directive 2010/40/EU on the framework for the deployment of Intelligent Transport Systems in the field of road transport and for interfaces with other modes of transport, namely:

- 1. Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2015/962 supplementing Directive 2010/40/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council with regard to the provision of EU-wide real-time traffic information services,
- 2. Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 886/2013 supplementing Directive 2010/40/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council with regard to data and procedures for the provision, where possible, of road safety-related minimum universal traffic information free of charge to users,
- 3. Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 885/2013 supplementing ITS Directive 2010/40/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council with regard to the provision of information services for safe and secure parking places for trucks and commercial vehicles.

Currently, the NAP provides for the information on multimodal traffic – individual automobile transport, rail passenger transport as well as available cycling routes, which are constantly being updated based on the data from the self-governing regions.

At the same time, the data are collected to extend the multimodal transport system by regular suburban bus services and public transport, with its consequent processing into a required form.
