SUBJECT: Report on the measures undertaken to set up a National Access Point and the modalities of its functioning - Delegated Regulation (EU) No. 2017/1926

According to Delegated Regulations (EU) No. 2017/1926, we are sending you our report on the measures undertaken to set up a National Access Point and the modalities of its functioning as follows:

At the moment, Croatia has not established National Access Point for multimodal travel information. Nevertheless, the contract for implementation of National Access Point for road traffic in Croatia according ITS Directive has been signed, and is expected to be implemented by the end of 2020, providing the road traffic information from major road authorities (motorways and state roads). Also, Study on Providing Multimodal travel information is at final stage within Activity 2 of Croatia Programme Support Action (PSA) for the implementation of Union-wide multimodal travel information services on TEN-T network MOVE/B4/2017-350.

One of the main tasks within the Study was to determine optimal solution for National Access Point regarding multimodal travel information. Taking into consideration costs as well as operational management, it is imposed that optimal solution regarding NAP for multimodal travel information should be extension of National Access Point for road traffic which should be established within Crocodile II Croatia project.

In conclusion, National Access Point for multimodal travel information is considered through three phases, first of which would be implementation/establishment of NAP, second phase to carry out a pilot project which would include limited number of stakeholders (one stakeholder in each transport sector) and finally full system implementation and integration in National Access Point.
